


## CELEBRATING 200 YEARS OF THE




STOCKTON AND DARLINGTON RAILWAY






Year 3 completed timelines of the history of the Stockton and Darlington Railway. They then completed their own versions of the Locomotion No.1.








Year 2 worked in their class to also look at the history of the development of the railway. We had some smiley faces!

They then created their own








Year 6 looked at the original stops along the line and then researched different areas.

Year 5 have a special module this half term looking at the entire history of the Stockton and Darlington Railway. They are our school experts!






We need to make a track to get all the way to the bridge.
